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Ministers Annual Report 2021 - 2022

Our Son recently turned 2 and a half, and for all that time a global pandemic has been with us. Its effects continue to shape our world, country and importantly our church. This past year we have seen perhaps the biggest effect of disrupted programming, absences from worship and uncertainty. While we are now learning to live with a new virus in our midst, it is still causing suffering and challenge for many. Nationally, and regionally I have only just recently been able to be part of in person meetings, while online meetings bridge the gap, there exists a deficit in relationship building at such events. Therefore, again much of the focus of this report mentions the pandemic and its effects.

With my technical skills I was called upon both regionally and nationally by both the Presbyterian and Methodist churches and nationally by the Presbyterian church to assist and manage several significant online gatherings. These included a general assembly and a special assembly. I wish to thank the parish for their grace to allow me to serve the wider church. It was very much appreciated by the wider church. As a result of the pandemic choices were required to be made by each church community as to how they would proceed considering the public health emergency presenting the country. The big question that church communities were faced with was whether to require proof of vaccination to enable larger numbers attending services. This occurred not long before Christmas, and as a peak time in the church calendar caused several difficult conversations to be had. Fortunately for us there was little

caused several difficult conversations to be had. Fortunately for us there was little division about the requirement to enforce a vaccine pass. This situation however did present several challenges for my colleagues. The parish council also decided that for the month of March we would not meet in person formally, rather meeting online with several small groups operating some reported that while they had gathered for worship in the morning they were still fellowshipping and studying God's word well into the afternoon.

We now have two new congregations to acknowledge. With the advent of the pandemic effort has been made to regularly make the service available via livestream, also a printed copy of the service is hand delivered to a number of housebound people. This has continued to support people with their faith journey, while not able or unwilling to meet in the large congregational setting. How we continue to work with and encourage and interact with these "new congregations" is a challenge for the year to come. Significant progress has been made to ensure that St Enoch's Alexandra is fit for purpose for 2022 and beyond. To this end the property team have overseen the earthquake strengthening and public safety upgrades well, also of late the carpet has been replaced and the vestry painted and repaired to a usable condition. This facility is something to be proud of and to share with our community. Following a significant grant from the Wesleydale Trust (Methodist) we have been able to significantly upgrade and provide video and technology to support worship both onsite at St Enoch's and Online. We have been incredibly blessed by the generosity of grant and gift providers that has meant little of the parish funds has been drawn on to enable these significant upgrades. As always, many people make the life of our parish possible, from those that contribute financially and in kind, to those that attend, to those that visit, to those that mow lawns and maintain our buildings, to those that lead worship and to those that govern. Thank you very much for your service to the parish and importantly to the kingdom of God.

I'd also like to thank my family for their contribution, often hidden to enabling our work together.

As the memories and effects of the pandemic continues to fade, I look forward to the next year, building on the lessons learnt and continuing together to share the love and good news of Christ to a world in desperate need.

There may be repairs to their irrigation system necessary when it is first used in the Spring. The wastewater upgrade in Clyde is dragging on slowly and we are not connected yet to enable the decommissioning of the septic tank system.

Worship and Formation Annual Report 2022

The Parish again looks back on another 12 months of worshiping in different ways, namely by attending Church, meeting in small groups or as individuals to view media presented services. Covid has provided the opportunity for others to be part of our wider Church community, and this is encouraging. Livestreaming of the services is happening regularly with reasonable viewings. It's certainly worth continuing. Thanks to Rev. Andrew Howley and Rev Dr. Robyn McPhail and the worship teams. Paper copies of our services are now provided to any parishioner upon request, including those housebound or in rest homes. While several baptism services were held during the year, some were also cancelled because of covid disruptions. Weddings were held at both St

Enoch's and St Mungo. The use of our Churches as a funeral venue appears to be declining. Outdoor services were held on the 'Village green' at St Enoch's and beside the Clutha River. Christmas worship included a Christmas music service, Christmas Eve service (both at St Enoch's) and Christmas Day Service at St Mungo's. Combined 5th Sunday services with the Anglicans have also continued, alternating between St Enoch's and St Aidan's. The earthquake strengthening at St Enoch's meant Parish combined services could be held St Mungos , but the work was completed with minimal disruption. Easter Sunday Service was led by Rev. Dr. Robyn McPhail at short notice as covid isolated Rev. Howley. Easter Lenten studies were held in Alexandra and Clyde. IRCA round the world 24 hours of prayer was held in March. (Rev.Dr R. McPhail and Rev. A. Howley). The Parish was also responsible for the World Day of Prayer (thank you Sue Melville) and the ANZAC service at Clyde - both subject to covid restrictions. The light Party also happened at Halloween albeit in a modified format. Thank you to Chris Beilby. Again thankyou to Rev. A. Howley and all who lead worship - A Team (V. Anderson, G. Gordon, P. Griffioen), L/C Team (L. Armstrong, R. McNamara, S. Hanning), Rev. Dr. R. McPhail. Services have also been lead by Kay Pringle and Rev. E. Stevens. Music is an integral part of our worship and it comes in many formats ,including recorded, on guitar, or Carole Randall's choir. Our musicians are- V. Anderson, A. Meyer, C. Treasurers Report to AGM 2022

I present to you my Treasurers report and Financial Statements for the 2021 – 2022 financial year, a year of Covid and construction!

The continuing presence and spread of Covid disrupted our face-to-face services as well as the hire of our facilities by outside groups this year. Due to a reduction of income, we were able to qualify and apply for the MSD Covid 19 Wage Subsidy. We also secured a grant from the Wesleydale Trust of \$15000.00 to be used to replace equipment 'borrowed' from Andrew and upgrade our technology. This has enabled live streaming of services during and after lockdowns and is now a regular feature of weekly services. This is also a great 'selling point' for the hire of our facilities.

This year we were able to hold a 'Mini Fair' at St Enoch's and several Garage Sales at St Mungo's 'with both raising over \$4000 each. A great effort and thanks to all involved. The long awaited St Enoch's earthquake strengthening finally started in the new year after more delays when the C.O.D.C. required additional engineers reports resulting in increased costs, which were covered by our Otago Foundation Trust funds. As mentioned last year, this has reduced the interest we receive. Breens completed the work very efficiently with as little disruption as possible.

Towards the end of the financial year, a donation was received to replace the carpet in St Enoch's. Quotes have been received and this work will be carried out shortly. This is a huge gesture and grateful thanks goes to the donor. N.B. No Parish funds will be needed to complete this work.

Grateful thanks must go to all our parishioners who give via the internet. Your regular donations have kept this Parish going BUT for how long? Last year's budget projected a deficit of almost \$11000.00 but the actual deficit is \$4792.00. Fortunately we received the Wage Subsidy funds, the Wesleydale Grant and some generous general donations, some from IRD tax rebates, BUT, we cannot rely on these 'one of' payments. With our upgraded facilities alongside Alexandra Community House, we need to promote our place as a venue for community events, activities, etc. There is real potential for them to be utilised more than an hour or so a week.

My thanks again to Don for your support, banking the weekly offerings, keeping the giving records and distributing the annual receipts.

Also, special thanks to Jennifer Bowie, who has been a bank signatory for many years and has now retired. We really appreciate all your support, Jennifer and we welcome Malcolm Moore as our new signatory.

Finally, Iwish to thank everyone who continues to support and contribute in any way to the life of our Parish.
